Classroom programmes are underway, class trips and sporting events are being organised and our assessment programmes in full swing.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES' NEWS

At our first meeting of the year our Board committed the major sum of \$61,500 towards technology equipment for your school. This will be spent on three class sets of chrome books, a 3D printer and 250 headphones plus setting up costs and training.

This expenditure is over and above the \$80,000 committed for 2016 from our school's operating budget and will ensure that our school continues to be at the fore front of IT provision for Year 1 to 6 students.

In week three our Board hosted three reviewers from the Education Review Office. This review of school organisation, curriculum delivery and student achievement was very comprehensive.

I expect a report on our school in April and will share their findings with you.

Earlier this week the Ministry of Education met Board members to plan for the replacement of eight of our oldest classrooms. This significant building exercise will be the biggest property development for many years.

Finally I draw your attention to the Board of Trustees' elections to be held in June of this year. Every three years parents, caregivers and community members are able to stand for election. More information will be available but now is the time to think about your possible involvement.

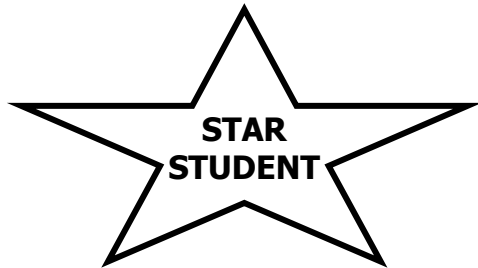

We have been writing lots of interesting facts about ourselves. We also love jumping into the swimming pool every afternoon to cool off in this hot humid weather.

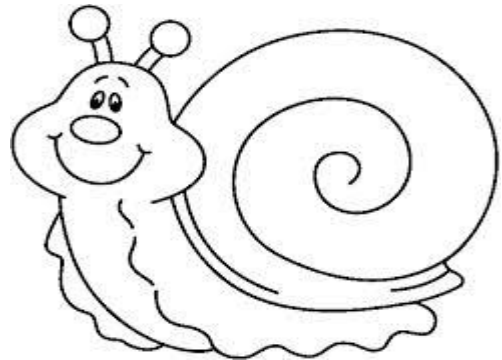


ROOM 5
