Thank you to everyone who ensures their children attend school regularly and on time.


Children do need to establish good habits both in attendance and being at school before 9am. Lateness disadvantages your child, as does leaving before 3pm.

If the number of Out of Zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot The Ballot will be held on Thursday 24 October 2024. If you are already a parent of a child attending our school, it is important that you

<u>Tītoki</u>

Term 3 began with parent interviews, where it was wonderful to share the great progress the children have been making. We are now fully immersed in our learning activities. This week, in celebration of Tongan Language Week, we've been exploring how to make an 'umu' and the traditional foods cooked in it. We are also excited about our first Tongan school fashion show and look forward to enjoying Lu moa (taro leaves with chicken) and manioke (cassava) tomorrow.

<u>Ti Koūka</u>

This week, we embraced Tongan Language Week, exploring Tongan culture through language and art. It has been fun but challenging manipulating our mouths to pronounce tongan words correctly. The students enjoyed learning Tongan phrases and participating in lunchtime activities. It was a wonderful experience that fostered respect and curiosity about the Tongan heritage. Our cross-country training is in full swing! The students have been working hard to build endurance and set personal goals. Their determination and teamwork have been impressive. In maths we've been learning about area and capacity through hands-on activities. Students have been measuring spaces and estimating volumes, developing important spatial skills. We've focused on enhancing our writing by developing language features like descriptive language and varied sentence structures.
