Welcome back to the beginning of another busy term. I hope you all had a restful and enjoyable couple of weeks despite the weather! I would like to welcome all our new families, and two members of staff; Ashleigh Cole who is teaching in New Entrants, and Tom Ruki who joins our property team as assistant caretaker

This term's value is diversity. The children understand diversity as "accepting and celebrating the similarities and differences of themselves and others." As a multicultural community our school caters for a diverse ethnic population. We celebrate and value a variety of cultures by recognising cultural differences and strive to ensure that all students feel culturally safe and valued.

We aim to create a learning environment that is caring and inclusive and attends to the cultural and linguistic diversity of our students. We appreciate that students may identify with more than one cultural group, and we value the histories and traditions of all our students. In school we do this by:

- integrating cultural perspectives through curriculum areas across all levels •
- providing opportunities for students, their families, and the wider school community to use and share their cultural knowledge
- being sensitive to all religious beliefs and belief systems
- demonstrating an awareness of and respect for cultural practices
- using our communication tools to share and celebrate cultural diversity with our school families ٠
- supporting students for whom English is not their first language
- reflecting different cultures in our school environment (e.g. signage, murals, artwork)
- celebrating festivals and significant holidays from a range of cultures
- running our own cultural events and activities (e.g. groups, assemblies, activities to celebrate language weeks, festivals, food festivals etc).

We also acknowledge the unique position of Maori as tangata whenua and are committed to the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. The Education and Training Act 2020 lays down the following objectives for Boards:

- to ensure plans, policies, and local curriculum include local tikanga, Māori, mātauranga Māori, and te ao Māori •
- take reasonable steps to offer or make available instruction in tikanga Maori and te reo Maori, and
- have equitable outcomes for Maori students. .

To support our work in this area, Te Rōpū Whānau was established last year. The purpose of this group is to give Māori parents and whānau a voice in our strategic planning. This year we are looking to grow the capacity of this group and are looking for new members. Applications will be received up to and including Monday 21 October 2024.


