CCTV Cameras

The school board will be reviewing our Privacy Policy at the next

Board meeting. As part of this process, we need to consult on the use of CCTV cameras. After the school rebuild project, cameras were installed on the exterior of the buildings to monitor entrances, the carpark and boundary lines with the purpose of deterring vandalism and intruders outside of school hours. Footage is captured by motion sensors and stored securely for a period of 28 days. The footage is only accessible by the Principal, Property Manager and ICT Technician, and will only be shared with police in the event of criminal activity. You will notice signage displayed at gates and on fencing to alert the public that CCTV cameras are in operation. The footage is not used to monitor classrooms or playground activity.
